5-Projected messages to stakeholders

Preliminary messages

- Mayors to raise their profile in driving water security
- Water governance as a means to an end
 - Need to for measuring the tangible performance and impacts of governance frameworks, institutions and mechanisms
- Water is a shared responsibility across levels of government and stakeholders
 - Stakeholders need to be involved form preliminary steps of water policy making for an effective implementation. Many stakeholders remain unheard
- A clear legal framework, transparent water governance and education to water culture are key for enhanced water security and access to water and sanitation.
