The 9th Forum is approaching. The world of water, development, but also of human rights and peace will be present in Dakar from 21 to 26 March.



The contributions of actors from all over the world have thus made it possible, in an inclusive approach, to propose relevant actions for improving access to water and sanitation, focusing on the four priority themes of water security, cooperation, water for rural development, tools and means.

Water has great value for health, education, culture, peace, environmental protection, etc. It is therefore

essential to consider all these aspects in order to effectively manage this precious and limited resource. This is why a global approach to water valuation is essential in order to integrate them into the activities of all the actors concerned by its production and use. The Dakar meeting provides the ideal platform to achieve this goal.

The enthusiasm generated by the great innovation that is the "Dakar 2022 Initiative" is also remarkable with a large number of projects already labelled with a real impact on the wellbeing of populations. The Forum's exhibition has also aroused great interest, with a rich and diversified set of exhibits including the Classic Expo, the African Village, the Sanitation Village, the Answers Route and the Senegal Space {Espace Senegal}. It is sure to be one of the Forum's major attractions.



A unique platform to catalyze collective action



The World Water Forum is the largest multistakeholder event in the water community. It has been organized every three years since 1997 by the World Water Council, in partnership with a host country, and provides a unique platform where the water community and key decision-makers can collaborate and establish long-term action plans on water challenges around the world. The World Water Council catalyzes collective action during and between each World Water Forum, the largest international water event.

The Forum brings together participants from all levels and fields, including politics, multilateral institutions, academia, civil society and the private sector. Over the years, the number of people participating in the Forum has grown from a few hundred to tens of thousands of representatives from the international community and host countries. The goal is to advance the global water agenda and strengthen the world's capacity to respond to the water-related challenges of our time.

THE WORLD WATER COUNCIL

Alternative approaches to emerging challenges



Established in 1996, the World Water Council is an international multi-stakeholder platform the mission of which is to drive action on critical water issues at all levels, including the highest level of decision-making, by engaging the public in debate and countering conventional thinking. The Council focuses on the policy dimensions of water security, adaptation and sustainability.

The World Water Council represents over 300 organizations in more than 50 countries. Together they form a unique network involving different sectors, regions, disciplines and professional fields with diverse expertise and interests. By pooling their efforts, members work to advance the water agenda. Their skills, experience and involvement contribute to solving complex water challenges around the world. Members help shape the Council's strategy and program by taking an active part in its various working bodies.

The World Water Council works to raise awareness of water issues among high-level decision makers. It seeks to put water at the top of the global political agenda and to design global policies to support authorities in developing and managing water resources and to encourage their efficient use. The Council strives to reach the entire political sphere: national governments, parliamentarians and local authorities, as well as United Nations bodies.

The World Water Council addresses the many issues facing water security and, as a force for change, seeks to do so by challenging conventions and generating new ideas. Working with its members and other stakeholders, the Council explores areas where it sees the potential to raise the profile of water. It seeks a more distinctive contribution to global water challenges by forming alternative approaches to emerging challenges.



9TH WORLD WATER FORUM DAKAR 2022

THE FORUM OF RESPONSES AND GREAT INNOVATIONS



Senegal will organize, from 21 to 26 March 2022, the 9th World Water Forum under the main theme of «Water Security for Peace and Development».

The success of the Forum, which will be organized for the first time in sub-Saharan Africa, requires a significant amount of preparatory work focused on an inclusive approach, proper identification and involvement of stakeholders, mobilization of adequate resources and timely implementation of activities.

• Vision of the 9th World Water Forum

The ambition of Senegal and the World Water Council is to organize a more socially, politically and economically effective Forum, a Forum that is a catalyst for action on water and sanitation commitments, a Forum that is connected to agendas, platforms and commitments related to the SDGs, the Sendai agreement on natural hazards and disasters, the Paris climate agreement, Africa's 2063 agenda, etc.), and a contextualized, global and grassroots Forum, anchored on the main water challenges of Africa and the world.

The 9th Forum is centered on an integrated preparation based on quality, multi-stakeholder exchanges around a limited number of priorities integrating the previous tools of the processes: thematic, political, regional, citizen. Thus, citizens will be at the heart of the 9th Forum.

Designed to be a «Forum of Answers», Dakar 2022 will address global issues for man and nature, today and tomorrow. The ambition is to accelerate the effective implementation of the global water agenda, which is a prerequisite for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, particularly in Africa, a continent where water is vital for human development.

The World Water Forum will have to strengthen actions in Africa and in the world, for universal access to water and sanitation in view of the weak and fragile progress, the increasing pressures linked to the climate challenge, the galloping demography, the uncontrolled urbanization, the pollution, etc. In a word, it is a question of fighting poverty and giving hope to those hundreds of millions of people deprived of the basics, particularly in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

THE COMPONENTS OF THE FORUM



The 9th World Water Forum is structured around three components:

Summit of Heads of State and major international institutions: in order to place water at the heart of the international political agenda, and to give a strategic dimension to the results of the "Dakar 2022" Forum, Heads of State and Heads of international institutions will participate in the event. A major Dakar Declaration is expected to be issued on this occasion.

The multi-stakeholder exchange platform bringing together all stakeholders, including government representatives, parliamentarians, local authorities, the scientific world, the private sector, civil society, young people, women, etc. This platform is based on an integrated and decompartmentalized preparation that favors multi-stakeholder exchanges around the Forum's four priorities.

The Dakar 2021 Initiative: In order to give a specific, innovative and catalyzing touch to the commitment of the world water community, Senegal and the World Water Council have launched the "DAKAR 2021 INITIATIVE" which aims at developing concrete projects the results of which will be presented during the 9th World Water Forum. At the end of October 2021, 71 projects have already been approved.

The large exhibition will include an African Village, a Sanitation Village and a Path of responses, all of which will promote the sharing of experiences by highlighting the best responses from around the world.

THE STAKEHOLDERS MEETING

The final stretch well underway



Under the chairmanship of Mr. Serigne Mbaye Thiam, Minister of Water and Sanitation, the stakeholders Meeting of the 9th World Water Forum was held on 14 and 15 October 2021 at the Abdou Diouf International Conference Center (CICAD) in Diamniadio. The purpose of the meeting was to deliberate on the proposals of the working groups, to take stock of the Dakar 2022 Initiative, to share logistical information and to provide significant political input for the development of the final Forum program.

The meeting brought together 430 people in person and 460 people connected via the digital platform, from 54 countries around the world, representing a diversity of political actors (ministers, local/territorial parliamentarians, authorities. basin organizations), civil society, academics and researchers, technical and financial partners, the private sector, youth, women, etc. It was marked by messages from the Steering Committee of the Forum, the City of Dakar, the Ambassador of the Forum (Youssou Ndour), the Ambassador of Japan, the Ambassador of France and the Ambassador of Morocco. They all called for an exceptional mobilization towards the "Dakar 2022" Forum.

Following the official ceremony, the Chairs of the working groups presented the outcomes of the two-year formulation of the Forum's content. Thus, 92 sessions were validated by the Steering Committee. Working sessions were organized with local elected officials, parliamentarians and basin organizations, with the support of the OECD, to

exchange on the different roadmaps leading to the Forum.

Furthermore, a high-level session was organized to link and synergize the 9th World Water Forum with the UN Water Agenda. The session was enhanced by the intervention of the Co-Chairs of the 2023 UN Water Conference, Mr. Ovink Henk, Special Envoy of the Netherlands for Water and Mr. Sulton Rahimzoda, Chairman of the Steering Committee of the Dushanbe Water Conference, in addition to the intervention of the National Assembly of Senegal, the Water Director of the World Bank, the Executive Secretary of AMCOW, the Secretary General of the United Cities and Local Governments of Africa (UCLG-Africa), the High Commissioner of OMVS and the representative of the Youth and Civil Society.

Following the summaries, the Executive Secretariat provided logistical information to reassure the world community on the level of preparation and capacity of Senegal to successfully host the 9th World Water Forum. The partners represented by the AfDB, the Arab League, UNESCO, the Platform of Civil Society Organizations for Water and Sanitation of Senegal reaffirmed their commitment to support Senegal for the organization of a successful Forum in every respect.







KEY ACTIVITIES OF THE AGENDA

1. Opening ceremony

The opening ceremony is scheduled for March 21, 2022 at Dakar ARENA in the city of Diamniadio in the presence of Senegalese high authorities, personalities from Africa and special guests of the Head of State of Senegal.

2. Policy Segments

a. Summit of Heads of State and Government and Major International Institutions

The Summit of Heads of State and Government and major international institutions - under the leadership of His Excellency Macky Sall, President of the Republic of Senegal - will demonstrate political commitment at the highest level to catalyze action for universal access to water and sanitation. As such, Senegal considers it important to make the Summit a key step in the UN process to prepare for the United Nations Water Conference in 2023.

b. High level panels

• Ministerial

Ministers are very influential decision makers, both designers and bearers of national public policies and international conventions related to water and sanitation. The mobilization of Ministers will allow to take stock of the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goal 6 at the level of their respective countries within the objective of the Mid-term Conference of the Water Decade, to consult with all actors and during the mixed ministerial dialogues in order to make commitments in favor of water security for peace and development.

Parliaments

Parliaments are the melting pot of territorial, categorical and political diversity - the interface between citizens and public institutions; they set up a legislative framework adapted to national and local specificities. They are also where national budgets are voted and where the executive branch is controlled. Parliaments represent the seat par excellence for political dialogue, impetus, elaboration, monitoring and control of cross-cutting issues such as water.

· Local authorities

Local and regional authorities are on the ground,

close to the people, and are aware of local aspirations. Within the context of population growth, urbanization and climate change, they ensure access to water and sanitation in cities and rural areas. They represent the basic level where water and sanitation issues are expressed, but also the basic building block on which effective and sustainable solutions are based. Local elected officials play an essential role in taking into account water-related priorities from the local to the Basin and from the Basin to the national level.

• Basin Organizations

In view of increasing water scarcity, particularly in many parts of the world, considering water allocation and distribution at the basin scale is essential to address broader issues of competition among water uses. Safeguarding and developing water resources are based on the upstream-downstream relationship of river basins, institutional relationships and effective information sharing within and between basins. A judicious allocation between different sectors of water uses and a balance between meeting human needs and those of aquatic ecosystems are therefore necessary. In this respect, the basin organizations and authorities play a key role both within each country and in transboundary areas, but also in building peace and resilience of States sharing common resources.

3. Thematic agenda

a. Keystone round table

These high-level panels (HLPs) focus on topics of particular importance, contributing to global processes (e.g., the SDGs), and involving the participation of influential leaders from various areas of government, business, academia, and civil society, such as ministers or high-ranking representatives. HLPs differ from other sessions primarily in that they involve the highest-level stakeholders in decision-making and/or influential global leaders or speakers. A certain number of "confirmed" high-level speakers/leaders is required to justify the request for an HLP. HLPs are decided by the International Steering Committee (ISC) on the basis of requests received.

b. Special Sessions

Special Sessions (SS) focus on a particular topic or cross-cutting issue that requires special

attention and/or articulation, highlighting topics that are gaining momentum and may be of significant interest to the water community. SS are also intended to provide opportunities to engage with sectors other than water. SS may also be proposed when there is a clear synergy or connection between two or more sessions (regular or special) that were originally proposed separately.

c. Regular Sessions

A Regular Thematic Session (RTS) is a session specifically related to the action plans developed by the 23 Action Groups (AGs) of the four Forum priorities. Directly linked to the Forum's thematic framework, regular thematic sessions are the result of active stakeholder engagement and participation, including a consultative process. The AGs lead the coordination and preparation of the OTS. During the thematic session, the GAs will present the projects and initiatives contained in the relevant action category of their plans and illustrate how these initiatives have contributed or can contribute to the achievement of the GA's objective as indicated in the group title

Side events

Side events will be organized in support of the Forum's priority themes in time slots that

correspond to the main sessions and flagship events.

4. Launch of the World Water Development Report

The World Water Development Report will be officially launched on March 22 during the Forum. Coordinated by UNESCO, this UN flagship Water Report provides a comprehensive and official assessment of the overall status, use and management of the world's freshwater resources and aims to provide decision-makers with tools to formulate and implement sustainable water policies.

The Report highlights best practices and potential response options as well as in-depth theoretical analyses to help stimulate ideas and actions in diverse water-related sectors. It reports on progress towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goal targets on drinking water and sanitation (SDG 6), as well as on changes in the resource and its management.

5. Technical and tourist visits

A program of technical and tourist visits will be planned for the participants to discover the achievements and cultural and tourist sites of Senegal highlighting the water issues.

SPECIAL PRIZES ON WATER AND SANITATION



Awards will be presented at ceremonies during the Forum, including the King Hassan II World Water Grand Prize and the Kyoto World Water Grand Prize. They will celebrate excellence and innovation in various fields related to water and sanitation.

Hassan II Great World Water Prize

Created in 2002, and awarded for the first time at the 3rd World Water Forum in Kyoto, Japan in 2003, the Hassan II Great World Water Prize is a joint initiative of the Kingdom of Morocco and the World Water Council, in memory of His Majesty King Hassan II for his actions in favour of international cooperation and the preservation of water resources. With the general theme of «cooperation and good management in the field of development and use of water resources», the Hassan II Great World Water Prize is awarded to a person, a group of persons, an institution or an organisation that has made an important contribution in the fields of development and use of water resources, at the scientific, economic, technical, environmental, social, institutional, cultural or political level. Since Kyoto in 2003, the Prize has been awarded every three years on the occasion of the World Water Forum, at a special ceremony. The Prize will be awarded for the seventh time at the 9th World Water Forum to a winner who will receive international recognition and visibility, as well as a cheque for USD 500,000.

Kyoto World Water Grand Prize

After careful consideration of the nominations by the prize committee, Pragati from India has been selected as the winner of the 2022 Grand Prize in recognition of her efforts to use natural energy not only to solve water problems but also to reduce environmental impact. Pragati will receive the JPY 2,000,000 prize at the closing ceremony of the 9th World Water Forum in Dakar, Senegal.

The Kyoto World Water Grand Prize is a prestigious international award that recognizes grassroots organizations in developing countries for their outstanding achievements in solving water-related problems in order to encourage the development of grassroots activities. The Grand Prize was established in 2003 by the City of Kyoto and the World Water Council in commemoration of the 3rd World Water Forum held in the Lake Biwa and Yodo River Basin, including Kyoto, Japan.

Since then, the Grand Prize has been awarded on the occasion of the World Water Forum held every three years. Since 2015, the Japan Water Forum has joined the organisers of the Grand Prize.

In keeping with the Kyoto tradition of «harmony between tradition and innovation», the selection process this time was based on the sustainability of activities and their contribution to «culture» and «community».



EXHIBITIONS/VILLAGES/RESPONSES PATH

The classic Exhibition (Expo/Fair), the Response path, the African Village and the Sanitation Village are the main Exhibitions of the Forum. To this, we must add the "Senegal Space" (Espace Sénégal), which will be the largest exhibition space.

• Expo/Fair

The Expo/Fair, which traditionally accompanies the Forum, will be a showcase for the issues and challenges related to water and sanitation. It will also be an opportunity to highlight know-how, technologies and major innovations concerning water, sanitation and the environment.

It will also be an important opportunity to bring together the various actors in the chain (researchers, scientists, manufacturers, product and service providers, users, etc.) and to make visible the solutions and answers provided to water and sanitation issues. It is also an opportunity for sponsors and partners to make themselves visible.

Path of Responses

The "Path of Responses" will be a space dedicated to the exhibition of the most adapted answers to the problems of water and sanitation, throughout the world, at the technological, technical, institutional and financial levels, as well as at the level of legal, political and economic governance, etc.

In the "Responses path", projects labelled "Dakar 2021 Initiative" will be exhibited, as well as other projects relevant to the Forum's priorities, having a strong impact on the populations and allowing to accelerate the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

African Village

An innovative feature of the Forum, the "African Village", will be an exhibition space, a framework for awareness, information and exchange on the concerns, issues and challenges related to water issues in Africa, and the specific responses to the problems of access to water over time.

It will also be a space for sharing experiences on good practices and innovations, but also a space for discussions to promote water security in Africa in order to meet the various objectives of the agendas.

Sanitation Village

The 9th Forum intends to highlight, over time, the issues and challenges of sanitation as well as the institutional, technological, technical, scientific and cultural responses to sanitation through a dedicated exhibition, called "Sanitation Village".

This major innovation, which will integrate a cultural dimension, will be a space for the expression of the "Forum of answers", for dialogue, sensitization, learning and promotion of innovations and technologies in the field of sanitation and hygiene. The Village will also take into account the different risks (sanitary, environmental) that must be managed but also the valorization of waste as a resource.

Espace Sénégal

The exhibition space of Senegal or "Espace Sénégal" will be a showcase of achievements, know-how, answers, innovations, technologies, projects and prospects of the Government, and the professions of the actors of water, sanitation and hygiene, but also a place of promotion of the country in its multiple facets.

USEFUL INFORMATION

• Reception of participants

Participants will be welcomed on arrival at Blaise DIAGNE International Airport, located 47 km south-east of Dakar. The Forum's organising committee will provide a reception service for participants.

• Entry visa to Senegal

The visa will be granted on arrival to any participant who applies online.

Citizens of member countries of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) do not need a visa to enter Senegal; a valid passport (preferably expiring only 3 months after the end of the stay) or a valid national identity card is required for them.

To be admitted to Senegalese territory, all foreigners must present: a passport valid for at least 6 months; an entry visa free of charge, unless exempted; a return or circular ticket or a transport title for a destination outside Senegal; international vaccination certificates required by health regulations.

To obtain a visa, the participant must go to the Senegalese Embassy in the country of departure or apply online.

Visa exemption:. Nationals of the following ECOWAS member countries: Benin, Burkina Faso, Cabo Verde, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Liberia, Niger, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Togo, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Mali, Gambia. Nationals of these countries are allowed to enter Senegalese territory on presentation of: a valid passport, a national identity card, or a laissez-passer; they must be in possession of the international vaccination certificates required by the health regulations.

• Controlling the Covid-19 pandemic and health regulations

In Senegal, daily statistics on the evolution of COVID-19 communicated by the Ministry of Health and Social Action show a very low number of cases and can be consulted on the Ministry's website https://www.sante.gouv.sn/taxonomy/term/14

Given this reassuring health situation, many international events are regularly held in Senegal.

Senegal's borders are open to all travellers wishing to visit, however in view of the current international health context, Senegal, like most countries, requires a negative test for Covid-19. The traveller must be able to present an official document attesting to the negative result of the RT- PCR-COVID-19 test dating back less than five (5) days or a "health pass" duly issued by the competent services.
